Troy Borough Mobility Plan Project Fact Sheet

Why do we need a study?

Troy is a vibrant community with a friendly, small town feel. In recent years however, the rise of energy-related activities such as those related to Marcellus Shale natural gas extraction has taxed the borough's transportation system. Roadways such as US 6 and PA 14 have historically been important to Troy, yet now these roadways have evolved into major goods movement corridors. Transportation issues within the borough are becoming more pronounced in areas related to intersection capacity, bicycle and pedestrian mobility, transit coordination and downtown parking conflicts. The borough believes the time is right to begin identifying specific actions that must be taken before those issues become major concerns.

Who is involved?

The Borough of Troy, along with Troy Township is collaborating with the Northern Tier Regional Planning & Development Commission and PennDOT to conduct the study, known as the "Troy Mobility Plan." The study will focus on evaluating how transportation projects and policies can support economic and community development, in addition to safety and mobility.

What is my role?

What transportation issues do you believe need to be addressed in the greater Troy area? What do you want the borough to look like in the future? The study team will ask you and your neighbors that question during study events. Based on your ideas and priorities, the borough will identify actions it can take to improve the safety and mobility of its transportation system, promote livability, and foster economic development.
